The areas we are going to work on are :- providing clear information about your child's progress throughout the year and appropriate homework tasks.

**The results from our Church questionnaire show that we need more links with the Lichfield Diocese not all parents know we are part of this wider Church family.**

We have been asked by many parents to donate to **SAL's shoes**.
