

## **Overview of Pupil Premium 2015-16**

### **Purpose:**

The Pupil Premium Grant is a specific Government funding allocated to schools to support pupils who belong to particularly “vulnerable” groups which at risk of not achieving at expected levels for their age. The groups of pupils who are funded by the Pupil Premium Grant are:

- Those eligible for Free School Meals (FSM)
- Children who are Looked After (CLA)
- Services children.

Funding for the financial year 2015-2016 year is £75,400, based on £1300 per eligible pupil. 28% (58) of our pupils in YR to Y6 are supported through pupil premium.

The information below provides a summary of how the Pupil Premium Grant for 2015/16 will be spent along with where information can be found.

### **Spending 2014-15:**

A detailed spreadsheet illustrates how the PP money has been spend on individual children, this is produced by the school’s Inclusion manager and is updated termly.

### **Initiatives:**

A range of interventions and strategies are used throughout the school to ensure that negative gaps are narrowed. These will change on a termly basis and are planned based on the needs of the children. These are:

- Mentoring, based on PASS survey results
- Better Reading Partnership (BRP)
- 5 Minute Box – English and Maths
- Precision teaching
- In class support
- Speech and Language support
- WELLCOMM
- Additional phonics sessions
- Handwriting and letter formation intervention
- Behaviour Support
- Interventions planned in light of assessment
- Increased subsidy for educational and recreational visits
- Whole school milk and fruit subsidy
- Whole class music
- Subsidy for both educational and recreational visits
- One to one tuition

### **Data Analysis:**

- Data for interventions and specific support for PP children is collated and analysed by the inclusion manager on a termly basis. This information can be found in the Inclusion Manager's file.
- PP children as a whole are tracked alongside all groups, their uplift and attainment is compared to the cohort and non PP children. This information can be found in the school's data file.
- A yearly evaluation will be created based on analysis of the above data. All data is shared and next steps planned for groups and individual children.
